### Precautionary Statements

<b>Prevention:</b>	Keep away from heat, sparks, open flames, hot surfaces - no smoking. Keep container tightly closed. No release into water. Use explosion-proof equipment. Use non-sparking tools. Take action to prevent static discharges. Avoid breathing vapors, mist, or spray. Wash affected area thoroughly after handling. Do not eat, drink or smoke when using this product. ### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

<b>Inhalation:</b>	Move to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Get medical attention.
<b>Skin contact:</b>	Remove contaminated clothing and footwear. Immediately flush skin with plenty of water (using soap, if available). Get medical attention. Wash clothing before reuse. Thoroughly clean shoes before reuse.
