Precautionary Statements

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Inhalation: Move to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is

difficult, give oxygen. Get medical attention.

Skin contact: Immediately flush skin with plenty of water (using soap, if available). Remove

contaminated clothing and footwear. Get medical attention. Wash clothing

before reuse.

Eye contact: Rinse immediately with plenty of water, also under the eyelids, for at least 15

minutes. Get medical attention.

Ingestion: Do not induce vomiting: contains petroleum distillates and/or aromatic

solvents. If vomiting occurs, prevent aspiration by keeping the patient's head below the knees. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Extinguishing media: Carbon dioxide. Dry powder. Alcohol-resistant foam. Water spray or fog. Do

not use high volume water jet.

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Special firefighting procedures: Wear self-contained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing, such as

turn-out gear. In case of fire, keep containers cool with water spray.

Unusual fire or explosion hazards: Vapors may form explosive mixtures with air. Vapors are heavier than air and

may travel along the ground or be moved by ventilation and subsequently ignited by heat, pilot lights or other ignition sources at locations distant from the material handling point. Hydrocarbon solvents are basically non-conductors of electricity and can become electrostatically charged during mixing, filtering or pumping at high flow rates. If this charge reaches a significantly high level, sparks can form that may ignite vapors of flammable liquids. Closed containers may explode when exposed to extreme heat.

Hazardous combustion products: Oxides of carbon. Oxides of nitrogen. Toxic fumes. Collect contaminated fire

extinguishing water separately. This must not be discharged into drains.

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES
