4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Inhalation: Move to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is

difficult, give oxygen. Get medical attention.

Skin contact: Remove contaminated clothing and footwear. Immediately flush skin with

plenty of water (using soap, if available). If symptoms develop and persist, get

medical attention. Wash clothing before reuse.

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Extinguishing media: Water spray (fog), foam, dry chemical or carbon dioxide. Do not use high

Special firefighting procedures: Wear self-contained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing, such as

turn-out gear. Keep personnel upwind of fire.

Unusual fire or explosion hazards: Vapors may form explosive mixtures with air. Do not handle or store near an

Hydrocarbon solvents are basically non-conductors of electricity and can become electrostatically charged during mixing, filtering or pumping at high flow rates. If this charge reaches a significantly high level, sparks can form that may ignite vapors of flammable liquids. Vapors may accumulate in low or confined areas, travel considerable distance to source of ignition, and flash back. In case of fire,

keep containers cool with water spray.

Hazardous combustion products: Oxides of carbon. Hydrocarbons. Acrid smoke and fumes.

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE
